

How to Use Magnolia Home by Joanna Gaines® Interior Wood Stain

SUPPLY LIST

- Magnolia Home by Joanna Gaines® Pre-stain Wood Conditioner
- Magnolia Home by Joanna Gaines® Water-Based Wood Stain (available in 12 different colors)
- Magnolia Home by Joanna Gaines® Water-Based Polyurethane
- Tack cloth
- 180 grit sandpaper
- Nylon/polyester paintbrush
- Lint-free cloth
- Wood putty and a putty knife if you're planning to stain damaged wood

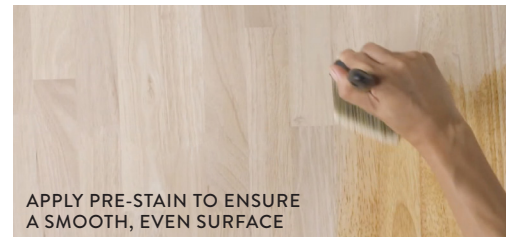
1 Prepare Your Surface

Prepare your surface to be smooth and completely free of any dirt, oil, grease, wax, polish, or dust. Once cleaned, use your sandpaper and sand in the direction of the wood grain. Clean the surface with a damp cloth.



2 Pre-Stain

Once the surface is clean, apply Magnolia Home by Joanna Gaines® Pre-Stain Wood Conditioner to help ensure color consistency. Allow 5-10 minutes for the product to dry, and wipe any excess with a dry cloth.



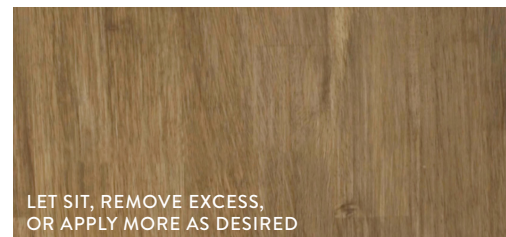
3 Stain

When the wood conditioner is fully dried, stir your Magnolia Home by Joanna Gaines® Water-Based Wood Stain, and lightly apply the product in the direction of the wood grain using a nylon/polyester brush.



4 Dry & Recoat if Needed

Allow the stain to dry for 1 hour. Apply another coat for darker color results. Do not sand between coats.



5 Protect

Protect your surface. Stir the Magnolia Home by Joanna Gaines® Water-Based Polyurethane, dip an inch of your nylon/polyester brush in it, hold the brush at a 45-degree angle, and run the bristles over the entire length of the wood.
